The Buffalo Center City Council met for a Public Hearing and Special Session on Wednesday, May 29th at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall. Council present: Hofbauer, West, Wirth, Haugen. Absent: Mayor Davids, Holland. Citizens present: Andrew Shaw.

Mayor Pro-Tem Hofbauer called the public hearing for the 2018-2019 budget amendment to order. He asked for public comment. There was none. West moved, seconded by Haugen, to closed the hearing. Three ayes, hearing closed.

Mayor Pro-Tem Hofbauer called the special session to order. West moved, seconded by Haugen, to approve the agenda. Three ayes, motion carried.

Haugen moved, seconded by West, to adopt Resolution 6-2019 approving the

2018-2019 budget amendment. Roll call vote: three ayes. Resolution carried.

West moved, seconded by Haugen, to adopt Resolution 7-2019 setting the date for public hearing on proposal to enter into a General Obligation Garbage Truck Acquisition Loan Agreement and to borrow money in a principal amount not to exceed \$110,000. The date was set for Wednesday, June 12, 2019 at 7pm at City Hall for the hearing to be held and proceedings will be instituted and action taken to enter into a loan agreement. Roll call vote: three ayes. Resolution carried.

Haugen moved, seconded by West, to adjourn the meeting. Three ayes, meeting adjourned.

City of Lakota Unapproved Minutes Regular Council Meeting June 3, 2019 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Heidecker called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. Council members present were Hagedorn, Janssen, Kitzinger, Meyer and Steven. City staff present were: Pam Robb, Sue Kearney and Jim Lentz.

Steven moved; Janssen seconded to approve the agenda. All approved, motion carried.

Kitzinger moved; Hagedorn seconded to approve the 05/06/19 minutes. All approved, motion carried.

Steven moved, Hagedorn seconded to approve payroll, payment of bills, bank statements and tax id reports presented. All approved, motion carried.

Public Forum-Tom Normandin was present to make the council aware of the two pit bull dogs at 501 Smith. Lynelle Roberts was present to discuss plans for old vet clinic, city speed limits, water plant project and city park activity. No action taken on these items. Lynelle also mentioned a possible pit bull at 510 Clark. Letter will be sent to 501 Smith and 510 Clark to have the pit bulls removed. Rick and Brenda Hagedorn were present to express interest in owning 410 Brewer lot that abandoned house sits on.

The following reports were given: City Clerk-Pam Robb provided council with city financial reports and one water shut off due to non-payment. Jon Kitzinger reported that the main fire truck overhead door needs to be replaced and a handicap sign needs to be ordered for designated handicap parking at Ambulance/Fire Station per a Medicare requirement. Valero will pay for the parts to get the 2011 pumper truck operational.

Letters will be sent to residents and homeowners with junky yards and unkept lawns to clean up or the city will do it and they will be billed accordingly.

Council was provided a letter from CDBG Water plant project grant administrator that the project needs to be completed by 12/31/20 or the \$255,000 grant funds will be lost.

Steven reported that the annual Memorial Day Program went very well, and attendance was great.

New Business
Steven moved, Janssen seconded to approve annual law enforcement contract with Kossuth County Sheriff's Office. All approved, motion carried.

Hagedorn moved; Steven seconded to approved Rick Meyer's bid to mow the lagoon pasture. All approved, motion carried.

Kitzinger moved, Hagedorn seconded to approve Resolution 2019.06.03, A Resolution Setting the Compensation for Appointed City and Utility Officers and Employees for Fiscal Year 2020. Roll-call Vote-Hagedorn-aye, Janssen-aye, Kitzinger-aye, Meyer-aye, Steven-aye.

Resolution 2019.06.03 carried.
Council agreed that evergreen tree in park by flagpole could be trimmed 3'-4' from the bottom.

City needs a better security camera system. It was discussed to write grants to cover the cost.
Streetlights were discussed, no action taken.

Hagedorn moved; Janssen seconded to adjourn meeting at 8:15 pm. All approved, motion carried.
